The telephone company will waive directory assistance fees and assist the visually impaired person to make phone calls in certain cases. "Big Dial" telephones are available featuring a re-dial and ten number memory as well as a three number "emergency number" capacity.

While reading through the information contained in this booklet, please keep in mind that **MOST AGENCIES for the visually impaired require their clients to fulfill one or more of the following criteria:**

- Have **LOW VISION/VISUAL IMPAIRMENT:** The ability to read standard printed material without special aids or devices other than regular glasses.
- Be **LEGALLY BLIND:** A visual acuity of 20/200 or less in the better eye after correction, or the widest diameter of the visual field in the better eye of 20 degrees or less.
- Have a **READING DISABILITY:** An organic dysfunction of sufficient severity as to prevent reading material in a normal manner.
- Have a **DETERIORATING EYE CONDITION:** A disease that may lead to blindness.
- Have an **APPLICATION FORM** completed and returned to the appropriate agency.
- Have a **LETTER FROM THE DOCTOR** or health care provider stating the disability and its extent.
- Be within certain **INCOME LEVELS:** There are circumstances in which this can be waived.
- Pay a **NOMINAL FEE** for certain programs: There are circumstances in which this can be waived.
